It is our intent is to provide every child with a curriculum that is broad, balanced, inspiring, and enriched with opportunities that extend beyond the classroom. By embedding half-termly enhancements, visits, and special events into our curriculum, we aim to remove barriers to opportunity, raise aspirations, and nurture confident, curious, and resilient learners.

We ensure enrichment is carefully planned, progressive, and inclusive by:

- Embedding half-termly curriculum enhancements, such as themed weeks, workshops, or special projects linked to current learning.
- Organising educational visits and residentials that bring learning to life and provide first-hand experiences of cultural, historical, and geographical contexts.
- Hosting visitors, speakers, and professionals.
- Providing opportunities for pupils to celebrate and learn about a wide range of cultures, traditions, and values.
- Offering after-school clubs, creative arts, sports, and music to extend interests and talents.
- Ensuring equity by supporting all children to access opportunities regardless of financial background.

These activities are not standalone "extras" but integral to our curriculum design, ensuring that every child benefits from high-quality, memorable learning experiences every half term.

The impact of our enrichment and cultural capital programme is that pupils:

- Experience a rich and varied curriculum that excites and motivates them to learn.
- Gain first-hand knowledge that deepens subject understanding and improves outcomes.
- Develop curiosity, independence, and resilience through real-life and practical experiences.
- Build cultural awareness, respect for diversity, and confidence in new and unfamiliar situations.
- Acquire the social and cultural capital needed to participate fully in society and succeed in the next stage of education and beyond.

We measure this impact through pupil voice, engagement in enrichment opportunities, attendance data, and by monitoring how pupils apply their experiences to improve their learning and personal development.
